OVERVIEW

Topic Education and Leadership

Age range 11-14

Subject Arts & Sciences

Duration 8 weeks

DESCRIPTION

This course explores the life and writing of Malala Yousafzai. Students discuss how education, leadership and service can lead to positive change. Students perform hands-on investigations and tasks while collaborating and communicating with partners.

TASK TOPICS	LEARNING OBJECTIVES Students will:
Task 1: Getting to Know Our Partners	 be able to share their culture with their global partners by creating a video to describe a typical school day, favorite activities and sports, and favorite holidays or celebrations. interact with their global partners about their videos.
Task 2: Education	 learn about Malala Yousafzai's story. discuss education's role in improving the world. articulate in poster form why education is important.
Task 3: Leadership	 examine different leadership styles. determine their personal leadership style. discuss leadership and what makes a great leader.
Task 4: Service	 discuss service and the importance of taking ownership. learn about the Malala Fund. create their own on-profit or service organization.
Task 5: Reflection	 reflect on the story of Malala and the Malala Fund's work. reflect on how education, leadership and service can lead to positive change. reflect on their culture and learning with their global partners.
